The School of Special Educational Needs: Disability (SSEND) is a team dedicated to building the capacity of Western Australian public schools to ensure students with disability (diagnosed or imputed) are able to access the curriculum on the same basis as their peers.

School principals or their delegates can request assistance from SSEND for students with eligible diagnosed or imputed disabilities.
